**Communication from Central Registered Body Scotland**

We have recently received communication in relation to the PVG scheme from Central Registered Body for Scotland (CRBS). They are the agency that process the PVG membership applications for your volunteers.

CRBS have stated that with immediate effect any Club or organisation that wishes to vet its members / volunteers / employees through the PVG scheme must have in place a contract between themselves and CRBS. Therefore in order for Cricket Scotland to be able to process and then forward PVG applications on behalf of your Club we are required that you have a contract in place with CRBS.

CRBS have stated the following on their website and I have underlined the key part:

***Secondary Organisation PVG Contract***

*This form must be completed by each of the secondary organisations that an intermediary body wishes to represent. CRBS will not process disclosure applications submitted for a secondary organisation until a contract form has been completed and approved by CRBS.*

I will stress that this is not a Cricket Scotland decision but one that has been handed to us and the Clubs.

I have attached the contract that the Club Child Protection / Welfare Officer must complete. Once completed please post to:

Once Cricket Scotland has your contract and forwarded to CRBS we will then be able to process PVG applications on your behalf.

Please be aware that only those conducting regulated work with children or regulated work with vulnerable adults need to become members of the PVG Scheme. Further guidance can be found at:
